


# Petaluma Elks Lodge #901 The The Whisperings





The GL has made some strong arguments regarding why this is untrue. However, we are in productive dialog with them and expect to be able to wrap that up early in the Elk year. To that end, there will be a vote at the March 23 Lodge Meeting wherein the membership wishes the board to become compliant or not. I strongly urge you all to attend as that will be a milestone in the history of our Lodge.

There is also the issue of replacing our poor, tired walk-in refrigerator/freezer. A large and costly project. And, of course, the daily issues of doing everything we want for our members while maintaining a balanced budget.

Whew! So, when you see your officers, try to see them as the proverbial 'ducks on the water'. Calm and collected on the surface. Paddling like crazy underneath!

So, let's have a good and productive year. I will try to keep you informed and I hope that you can feel free to come to me with anything that you think is important to our Lodge.

### Veteran's News

Back again for another month. To make a short story long (to fill out the column), some time ago, I was approached by Wayne Wilson who asked if I was familiar with the "Welcome Home Kit" program run by the Elks National Veterans Service Committee (ENVSC). "Nope" was my well thought out reply. Well, I quickly learned that the "Welcome Home Kit" is a program that encourages local Lodges to support Veterans, who for one reason or another, were basically homeless. I learned that the COVID pandemic caused a number of people to lose their homes and means of making a living. Many of these men and women are Armed Forces Veterans. Through the Veterans Administration. programs were established to find housing and employment for these individuals. The Elks, recognizing their promised duty to the Veteran, enlisted to assist in some of the programs. One that stands out is the 'Welcome Home Project"

The WHP allows us to work with the various veteran's organizations seeking housing for those veterans who are or have experienced homelessness. If the vet successfully completes the screening process, they are referred to housing with the assistance of the V.A. for partial rent payment. In some cases, the vets have only the clothes on their backs and a few personal belongings. This is where the Elks step in. Through the ENVSC guidelines we are able to reach out to the vet and offer assistance in getting set up in their own residence. We are allowed to spend up to \$300 per vet on household supplies, clothing, sustenance and other items to get them settled in. With submitted receipts, the \$300 spent by the



ENVSC (which, undoubtedly, gets turned around to help another vet).

I found that the hardest part of getting started in this is establishing a relationship with the assisting agency. I eventually reached out to the Nation's Finest Organization. Our region's NFO is headquartered in Santa Rosa. Being short-staffed causes some considerable delays. Fortunately, an anonymous 901 member donated a huge box of clothing and other items for distribution to Rocca House and Hearn House, both which come under the umbrella of the Nation's Finest. I delivered it to the NFO and, voila, the doors were opened and I was put in contact with case workers who were thrilled for the support we propose to offer. I was placed in contact with a veteran and prepared myself to work with him. I will try and give you an update of my first recipient contact in a following issue. Once I get all the bugs worked out, I hope to open the project to other members to get involved. I look at it this way: "WE ARE NOT GIVING A HANDOUT, WE ARE GIVING A HAND UP."

While on the topic of donations, fellow Elk Butch Smith and I brought a good amount of items to Yountville on February 15th. My car was loaded with candies, microwave popcorn, peanuts, birdseed and other items to be used as bingo prizes. Two very large boxes of Depends were also dropped off. Thank you to all that contributed (and keep it up).

Finally, all Elk 901 Armed Forces Veterans will be honored with a dinner at the Lodge on THURSDAY,

The Lodge will be represented by Exalted Ruler Rich Spickler, Exalted Ruler-Elect Wayne Wilson and Lodge Secretary Larry Sartori.

We are selling Liquor License #57-324064. The purchase price is \$170,000.00 (One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars).

Our plan for the monies is to hold them in a Restricted General Ledger Account until approval. Then we will deposit the monies into our Edward Jones Investment Account.

We are selling "57" license because in 2018 Lodges were instructed to convert their license to a Private Club "51" license so as to be compliant with federal tax rules.

The vote to move forward will take place on March 23, 2023 in the Lodge Room at the Petaluma Elks Lodge during our regularly scheduled meeting.


Going shopping? Please remember the Yountville Veterans. Find a copy of the VETERANS' WISH LIST on our




