The Spotlight Grant that our Lodge provided to Sonoma Family Meal (SFM) will feed 100 families!

We would like to express

our deepest gratitude for the incredible work that Sonoma Family Meal is doing to alleviate hunger in our community. Food insecurity is growing exponentially for families and seniors who have experienced disasters, lost jobs, or simply fallen off the financial ledge that once sustained them. Sonoma Family Meal serves 2,000 meals per month to our community. They believe people deserve wholesome, prepared meals once a week as a supplement to groceries. SFM partners with organizations including the

Resource Center, ELIM and CURA to provide prepared meals that can simply be popped in the oven and ready to eat 45 minutes later — a muchneeded night off to working parents or a loving food hug to seniors living alone.

Their work also supports local farmers and ranchers with much needed income and makes use of produce that would otherwise go to waste. Sonoma Family Meal is hoping to double their food distribution numbers this year.

The impact that Sonoma Family Meal has on our community is truly commendable, and Elks are honored to contribute to their efforts. We believe in the importance of coming together to support those in need, and their organization exemplifies this spirit.


Ponder this, if you were playing Bingo, what would your favorite prize be?


