Membership Is Special

Members of the Elks enjoy privileges that are unavailable to the public and those who have let their membership lapse. For instance, members can enjoy a great burger on Wednesday nights or the special events we have. We enjoy inexpensive drinks, weekly dinners, occasional karaoke and trivia nights, monthly paint nights. We also enjoy flat screen tv's, pool tables, dart board, shuffle board and a gym. This is just a portion of what your membership dues pay for. Divide the cost of your dues \$120.00 by the approx. 210 days we are open, the cost of your membership is just 57 cents/day. None of these benefits are available to the public or to former members who have surrendered their privileges. Lodge guests are always welcome, but they may only enter the Lodge when accompanied by a member. You may not know this, but former members that have been dropped from the membership rolls cannot enter any Elks Lodge for any reason, not even as a guest of a member in good standing, Every year, some members of our Lodge will surrender their Elks privileges as a result of non-payment of dues, which is a terrible loss for them and the Lodge too. But every Elks Lodge is a private club and like any other private club access is restricted to members only. This is done to protect the rights, privileges and benefits

of those members in good standing. Frankly, it would be foolish to pay a fee to enjoy the benefits of membership if everyone could enjoy the same benefits without paying a membership fee. Members would rightfully complain about such an injustice. The Lodge bears the responsibility of protecting its members in good standing. As always, we encourage our members to invite their friends and relatives to join us for a nice dinner at the Lodge or invite them to attend one of our outstanding events. The Lodge welcomes such socialization. In many cases, these people are so impressed with our facilities and hospitality that they've asked to become members themselves. One of the reasons our Lodge has such great facilities and wonderful events is to reward our members for their loyalty and for continuing to be members in good standing. That's why it's important to understand that the Lodge is not a public facility and why membership truly does have its privileges. If you have received your dues notice and have yet to renew, now is the time. If financial hardship requires you to seek relief from renewing your dues, there are options available. 

What is the Elks National Foundation?

The mission of the ENF is to help Elks build stronger communities. They fulfill this pledge by investing in communities where Elks live and work. They help youth develop lifelong skills, send students to college, meet the needs of today's veterans, support the charitable work of the state Elks associations, and fund projects that improve the quality of life in local Elks communities.

Since inception, the ENF has contributed more than \$500 million toward Elks charitable projects nationwide. Our programs continue to grow each year, allowing Elks to do even more to build stronger communities.

This year, the ENF allocated nearly \$16 million to fund the Community Investments Program, investing in Elks communities through grants for Elks Lodges. Community Investments Program grants offer your Lodge an opportunity to serve your

community in ways that will raise the Lodge's profile, energize the membership, encourage former members to return to the fold, and gain the notice of people who want to be part of an organization that's doing great things.

The ENF is able to help Elks build stronger communities thanks to contributions from our generous donors. Since inception, they have received more than \$288.7 million in contributions and bequests. Today, they have more than 124,000 active donors and an endowment fund valued at \$806.6 million.

The Foundation returned to the state \$1.734 for every dollar received by the Foundation from California-Hawaii Elks members. That translated into \$1,997,020.00 back in Grants and Programs. So, you see by donating to ENF you get a big bank for your buck.
