





A Letter from the Petaluma Elks Hall Association

As you are aware, the Grand Lodge has been pressuring Lodge 901 to compel the Hall Association to comply with Statute 16.030. This ongoing challenge has placed significant strain on both Lodge 901 Officers and the Hall Board of Directors. The Hall has retained legal counsel, as has Lodge 901. However, rather than working collaboratively with these attorneys to develop a resolution, the Grand Lodge—through its representative, Brad Smith—continues to malign the Hall Association and its board members, fostering distrust and animosity among Lodge 901 members.

REBUTTAL

In the January issue of Whisperings, Lodge 901 published an article by Brad Smith containing multiple inaccurate and inflammatory statements. In response, our attorney has formally requested a retraction from Lodge 901's attorney, stating that the article "demonstrates a fundamental misunderstanding of the California Corporations Code and the legal and factual issues" at hand.

The article makes several allegations, which we address below:

Allegation 1: The Hall, through its Board of Directors, is in violation of Grand Lodge statutes.

Reply: The Petaluma Elks Hall is a separate legal entity from Lodge 901, with no legal affiliation with the Grand Lodge. . Since it was formed 120 years ago, the Hall has never been subject to the jurisdiction of or control by the Grand Lodge or Lodge 901. As such, the Hall is not legally required to comply with Grand Lodge statutes and cannot do so unless a majority of its members vote otherwise.

Allegation 2: The Hall, through its Board of Directors, is in violation of the California Corporations Code.

Reply: The Hall is fully compliant with the California Corporations Code. In fact, forced compliance with Grand Lodge Statute 16.030 would constitute a violation of the Code. Compliance with this statute would require members to be divested of their membership rights, either through reorganization or dissolution of the Hall. Under California law, the Board of Directors cannot divest members of their interests without an affirmative vote of the membership.

Allegation 3: The Hall, through its Board of Directors, is in violation of IRS statutes and is exposing itself to significant legal risk

Allegation 4: The Hall, through its Board of Directors, is asserting independence from the Lodge.

Reply: Mr. Smith asserts that "continu[ing] to assert the Hall's independence from the Lodge violates Internal Revenue law and subjects the directors and officers of the Hall to significant legal implications with the IRS." The Hall is not asserting independence from Lodge 901. To clarify, the Hall's corporate tax structure requires it to benefit a nonprofit entity, which it does by supporting Lodge 901. However, while the Hall benefits Lodge 901, neither the Lodge nor the Grand Lodge has the authority to mandate compliance with Statute 16.030. Only a majority vote of the Hall membership and a bylaw amendment can enact such a change.

Allegation 5: The Hall, through its Board of Directors, is commingling funds.

Reply: This is a serious accusation that unjustly tarnishes the reputations of past and present Board Members, all of whom are or were members of Lodge 901. Without supporting evidence, publishing such untrue claims against fellow members is irresponsible, unbecoming, and not conducive to resolving these issues for the benefit of our membership.

MOVING FORWARD

The Hall Board of Directors has no authority to comply with the Grand Lodge's demands without a majority vote of its membership. To date, the Hall has only been able to conduct an advisory vote, in which the membership opposed compliance with Grand Lodge Statute 16.030. A majority vote requires over 400 members to vote in agreement, the advisory vote garnered only 271 total votes with 178 votes to not comply.

The Board believes a viable resolution lies in an agreement stipulating that, in the event of Lodge dissolution, the Hall's real property assets would be returned to the local community. Such an agreement may encourage a majority of the Hall membership to vote in alignment with the Grand Lodge's wishes.

The Hall Board of Directors urges the Grand Lodge and Lodge 901 to engage constructively with legal counsel to find an appropriate resolution. We also call for an end to the false accusations, divisive rhetoric, and misrepresentations that only serve to deepen discord among Lodge 901 members.

Petaluma Elks Hall Association Annual Meeting, and Nominations & Vote for Directors

The Petaluma Elks Hall Association owns and manages the physical building that Lodge 901 calls home, and holds an **Annual General Meeting** each year to share financials with our members – the members of Lodge 901. You are invited to attend on March 27 for a Dinner at 6:00pm, meeting at 6:30pm. Members enjoy dinner free of charge, compliments of the Hall Association and guests are charged a reduced amount. You must reserve both free and guest dinners online in advance at elks901. org/store.

Nominations are now open for 3 positions on the Board of Directors. If you are interested in serving a 3-year term, contact Rick Nadale or email PetalumaElksHallAssociation@gmail.com.

Ballots for voting for Board of Director positions will be mailed by March 1 to every member of Lodge 901. If you do not receive a ballot and cannot attend in person vote, please contact the Hall at PetalumaElksHallAssociation@gmail.com.

Roses are red Violets are blue Here's more about Valentine's Day Than you probably knew.

The holiday's origins, according to npr.com, date back to ancient Rome where the feast of Lupercalia was celebrated from Feb. 13 to 15. Lupercalia honored Lupa the she-wolf who nursed and sheltered Romulus and Remus and was aimed to please the Roman fertility god Lupercus. During the festival, Roman men would sacrifice a goat and a dog. The men would then run around naked or nearly naked, hitting women with the hide of the freshly killed animals. Women would line up to be hit, believing it would make them fertile. The women's names were then placed in a jar and the men would draw a name to see who they would be paired with for the remainder of the festival. According to History.com, Pope Gelasius I, to expel pagan rituals, combined the festival with St. Valentine's Day in the fifth century. The holiday seemed to mature from the revelry of ancient Rome to a day of romantic love over time.
